She served on the UNC Board of Governors for 17 years and has also served on the GAA Board of Directors, Graduate School Advisory Board, Friends of the Library Board of Directors and the Class of 1966 Reunion Committee. She is a member of the Chancellor's Philanthropic Council and the Carolina Women's Leadership Council, both dedicated to the success of For All Kind: the Campaign for Carolina, the University's most ambitious fundraising effort ever.
